

Communication and Language


- Retell a story using story telling language.

- Talk about music and how it makes me feel.


Understanding the World


- Recognise that people have different beliefs.

- oo the short sound in book and look
- oo the long sound in zoo and moon
- or in fork
- ur in fur and burn
- **ow** in cow
- oi in boil
- ear in hear and beard
- air in hair
- er in tower

It's great to hear that the children are finding so much pleasure in reading these books! © Reading at home is so important to help the children build on those skills they have been taught at school and what better way to learn when they are finding it so pleasurable. You child has two books:

- A reading practice book -Collins Big Cat (this book says Little Wandle on the cover) This book has
 been carefully chosen and matched to your child's phonetic ability and will be at the correct phonic
 stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently. We encourage
 children to read this book three times.
- A sharing book. Your child may not be able to read this book on their own as it is not fully decodable
 and may not match their exact phonics level. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.
